PeaceHealth promotes health and wellness during the World Athletics Championships Oregon22



EUGENE, Ore. – PeaceHealth is excited to welcome the world to Eugene for the World Athletics Championships Oregon22, July 15–24.

As the event's Official Healthcare Supplier, PeaceHealth will support medical tents for athletes, staff, volunteers and spectators. Dr. Hans Notenboom, PeaceHealth emergency medicine physician, is the event's medical director, and nearly 40 PeaceHealth registered nurses will volunteer their time and expertise in the medical tents during the 10-day event.

PeaceHealth will host a booth near the Tower at Hayward Field offering free souvenir slap bracelets and the opportunity to win a free step tracker. The theme is "Don't Just Take Steps, Make Strides," while PeaceHealth volunteers promote the <u>Strides for Social Justice</u> app, a series of self-guided tours throughout Eugene focused on the experience and contributions of Black residents. The booth will be open every day of competition, from roughly an hour before each session to the end of each session

PeaceHealth also is pleased and grateful that Strides for Social Justice has been invited to join the city of Eugene's engagement tent at the Eugene Riverfront Festival in the new 4-acre Downtown Riverfront Park.
