Fiesta Cultural Returns to Pre-Pandemic Programming Levels

Lane County's largest celebration of Latino/a/x/e arts, culture, and heritage holds events in Eugene, Springfield, and Florence

Fiesta Cultural, Lane County's largest celebration of Latino/a/x/e arts, culture, and heritage is making a comeback in 2022 with in-person and virtual programs and events happening throughout Lane County from September to December. The initiative led by Lane Arts Council to highlight Latino/a/x/e artists and connect our communities through the arts began in 2015. The first year saw a modest start with just six events but quickly grew to over forty events throughout Lane County by 2019. In that year, just before the global shutdown, the September Fiesta Cultural Kick-off event brought 2,000 attendees to downtown Eugene. The Covid-19 pandemic caused a shift in programming in 2020 to a mostly virtual format and a limited number of in-person events happening in 2021.

This year, the 8th Annual Fiesta Cultural returns full force to engage Lane County residents with in-person multicultural programs, activities, and events produced by the Latino/a/x/e community. The Fiesta Cultural Kick-off on September 2, 2022 featured an artist marketplace, food trucks, and music by DJ Caliente and Organización Oaxaca. Over 1,000 people attended the free event at the new Farmers Market Pavilion in downtown Eugene. The month of September has already seen thirteen cultural events including the Hispanic Heritage Celebration in Springfield and a Charro Attire Exhibition in the downtown Eugene Windowfront Exhibitions.

Florence offers Fiesta Cultural Events in October

Lane Arts Council collaborated with <u>Siuslaw Public Library</u>, <u>Florence Regional Arts Alliance (FRAA)</u>, the <u>Siuslaw Pioneer Museum</u>, and Latino/a/x/e artists and cultural producers to bring new events to the coast. Events and exhibitions include:

Fiesta Cultural Events continue through December in Lane County

Throughout the rest of the fall, Fiesta Cultural will feature dozens of cultural events that highlight Latino/a/x/e artists and celebrate the diversity of Latino/a/x/e arts and culture. - Salsa & Bachata Fridays, every Friday, lesson at 9pm and open dancing at 10pm, Vet's Club, 1626 Willamette St (upstairs), Eugene
